"So why so many different colors?"

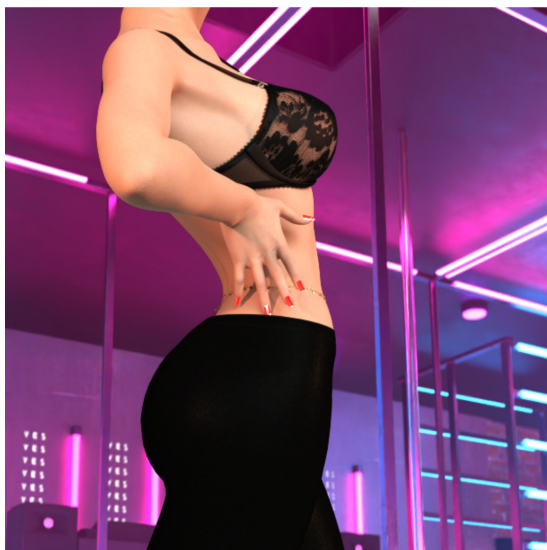
